Hot Breakfast Program Relaunch

In 2020 and 2021, the Redlands Charitable Resource Coalition utilized the Family Service kitchen area to provide lunches on a daily basis. Through this partnership thousands of meals were served to homeless and at-risk homeless families and individuals.

During the last quarter of 2021, we relaunched a Hot Breakfast Program, which provides a hearty meal, snacks, and drinks to individuals facing food insecurity. Serving around 60 meals each day, volunteers and generous community donations made our Hot Breakfast Program a win for all involved. Led mainly by volunteers, supported by generous community donations, participants received delicious quality, nutritional food. In one quarter alone, 4200 meals were served, demonstrating the huge need in the community we serve.

Thank you to all our volunteers, donors and community members who supported this program in 2021 and continued to do so today.

In early 2021, an elderly disabled couple visited the Yucaipa office to apply for emergency rental assistance. Both the husband and wife were on social security and limited income. They had fallen behind on their rent and bills due to the familial and health challenges they were facing including the wife being in the early stages of dementia. The couple, guided by a local social worker, requested financial assistance from Family Service. After meeting with a case manager, FSA was able to pay their rent and provide food and gas cards to stabilize their crisis.

Stabilization Success Story

Being a single mother is a job on its own. When your child is suddenly struck with a severe medical condition, it can feel impossible. For this mother, it meant having to take time off work, medical expenses and increased childcare costs given the COVID-19

restrictions on visitors allowed at the hospital. All of this led to falling behind on rent. Thankfully, she was able to receive assistance through Family Service's Housing Program. By providing this important service, this family continues to have a safe place to call home.

Stabilization Success Story

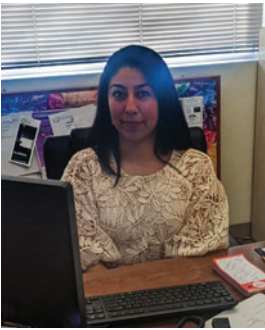
The pandemic has taken its toll on everyone. For a two-parent family with two children in Yucaipa, it meant almost losing their home. When schools closed and with limited outside support, the family had to make a tough decision regarding daily care and homeschooling. The dad opted to stay home and care for the children while mom continued to work. The loss of dad's full-time employment and the mom's new fluctuating hours meant they were unable to make mortgage payments for a couple of months. The family arrived at the Yucaipa Outreach Project panicked and worried with a past due mortgage bill. With the help of the City of Yucaipa and Maranda's case management skills, we were able to provide mortgage assistance as well as food, gas and new uniforms for mom to wear to work. Now, the family is stabilized and aware that the Yucaipa Outreach Project is there for them if they need help in the future.

Stabilization Success Story

A low income family with two children came to Family Service in the spring of 2021. The husband and breadwinner of the family ended up in the hospital with COVID-19 and was off work for two full weeks. A series of other hardships including the entire family being ill with COVID-19 caused the family to fall behind on their rent. Under Vanessa's guidance, Family Service was able to issue emergency financial assistance, to pay their rent and stabilize their housing crisis. The family also received transportation assistance, food and other wraparound services to help them get caught up and back on budget.

Finding a new home to move into can be exciting, but it can also be daunting when the deposit costs are more than you can afford. In the case of an elderly, disabled and homeless man, such was the situation. After meeting with Paula, the client was stabilized into a motel. In partnership, the client and Paula worked diligently to talk to landlords and research affordable options. After several weeks, a new place to move into was found in alignment with the client's income. However, a series of other challenges, including a delay in receiving benefit income, disallowed the client to move into the unit in a timely manner. With the help of Paula's resourceful case management style, Family Service was able to quickly qualify the client for assistance which covered his first month's rent and deposit costs. With this support, we kept the client safe and away from the imminent dangers of homelessness.

Meet Kelvin and Kim Bryant!



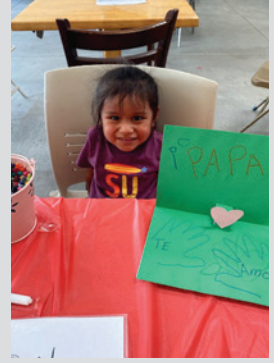

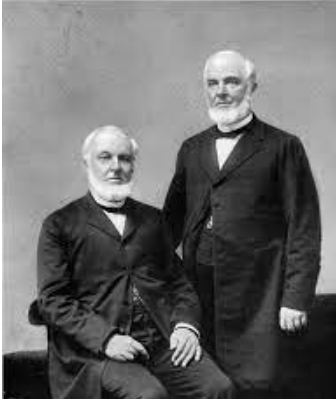


Fall Food Drive

The 2021 Fall Food Drive, with the essential leadership of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, assisted Family Service in collecting close to 40,000 pounds of food in one weekend. A little over 200 volunteers came out to support us in the fight against hunger.



Donor Recognition



Every year, Family Service honors special and significant donors to the agency with a social gathering and recognition ceremony. The highest honor, known as the **Alfred H. Smiley Philanthropic Award** is given to an important donor/s whose continued generosity is vital to operations and programming.

A visionary and philanthropist who believed strongly in service to others, Alfred H. Smiley founded what is now known as **Family Service**. In 1898, with the mission to *“Alleviate Poverty, Encourage Self Sufficiency and Promote the Dignity of All;”* Smiley launched what would today become a multi-service, safety net organization focused on fighting hunger and homelessness. The award

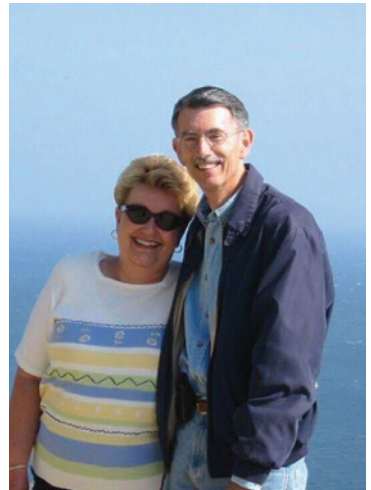
was created in 2009 to honor not only Smiley’s work, but the work of many, many others who have come after him.

The agency also honors several donors for **“Answering the Call”** which is defined as providing resources to fill in a gap in service within programming or administration.

2021 Highest Philanthropic Award

In 2021, Family Service recognized **Nancy and Tilden Spencer** of Redlands with the agency’s highest honor, the **Alfred H. Smiley Philanthropic Award**. Nancy has given of her time and treasure in an incredibly significant way for many decades.

Nancy Spencer is one of the organizations’ past presidents, having served from 1998-2000. Her dedication to Family Service over countless years includes serving as 2nd vice president and secretary as well as in many other capacities in support of the agency’s programs, services and events. Her husband, Tilden Spencer, is a retired teacher who worked at Mentone Elementary School for 34 years. Together, they have always believed in the work and programming Family Service provides.



Donor Recognition



Dr. Timothy Watson of Mission Pediatrics received the “**Answering the Call Award**” for his generous support of the agency’s Food Box Drive Thru initiative. The program, developed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, helped provide 1,000 families with access to much needed food. Interestingly, Dr. Watson practices in a historical building located at 114 Vine Street from which Family Service once administered services. A history buff,

Dr. Watson has ensured renovations to the structure are consistent with the building’s original look and feel. The ambiance helps provide a whimsical and kid friendly environment to the attentive service he provides his patients.

The second recipient of the **Answering the Call Award** was the **Will J. Reid Foundation** which provided funding for motel vouchers and food through two generous grants over the past several years. With the contribution from the Will J. Reid Foundation, as well as other partners, Family Service provided 532 motel vouchers to families who had no other shelter options. Recipients were kept safe and away from the imminent dangers of homelessness while they worked with a case manager to secure other housing options.

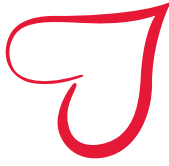
